Always read the instructions, on both the product and the spreader, and make sure you are using the correct setting.





Why are the settings different?

Each spreader model applies product at different rates. By using the correct setting for your spreader/product combination, you can be sure of the correct application.


How to achieve even application

We recommend applying the product on the perimeter and then in tramlines, up and down the lawn, whatever its shape.



What are passes?

'PASSES' refers to the number of times the product is applied to your entire lawn using a spreader (similar to the number of coats of paint you apply when decorating). By covering the lawn in different directions you avoid untreated gaps between tramlines. For example: for '2 passes' you cover the entire lawn 2 times to ensure the right amount of product is applied. On the diagram the first pass is white & the second yellow.



To achieve a great looking lawn follow these steps to keep the lawn in tip top condition.

1. FEEDING

Start to feed your lawn in spring and through to the autumn.

2. WEEDS & MOSS

Even with the best care and maintenance lawns may get problems with moss and weeds. Apply the right product to remove the problem avoiding heavy infestation at a later date.

3. SCARIFY

By raking your lawn you will remove dead grass, weeds moss and leaf letter which has built up over time, allowing more space for grass to grow and thicken.

4. AERATING

By spiking a lawn with a fork this will help relieve compaction and is good for a poorly drained lawn.

5. MOWING

Mow once a week to keep the weeds down and encourage the lawn to grow more thickly.

6. DRESSING


Apply a lawn dressing to improve the structure of your lawn, developing stronger roots and evening out any lumps and bumps.
